The Bernardine Center provides a helping hand to low-income Chester area residents by distributing emergency and supplemental food and supplies. It also provides educational programs to help clients build better lives for themselves, their families, and their communities.

Bernardine Center History 1986-2012

The Bernardine Franciscan Sisters began the Bernardine Center as a 501c3 outreach agency (under the non-profit umbrella of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia) designed and operated to help break the cycle of poverty in the Chester area. Its goals are twofold:

- To meet the needs of economically impoverished families
- To empower individuals and groups to bring about permanent change for themselves, individually and as a community.

Parenting Classes Thirteen individuals including custodial care-givers participated in interactive lessons with specific program goals and objectives to promote stable & strong family relationships. Clients were selfreferred as well as referred by the Family Court of Delaware County.

Anger Management Classes Thirtyseven individuals completed a 4-week series of two-hour interactive classes helping to identify hidden and expressed anger in relation to personal control and power issues as seen through anger triggers, warning signs and negative reactions. Participants learned self-talk, self-control, and acceptable expression of angry feelings.

Westside Brunch Three times a week from 10:00 AM - 12 Noon, BC staff and volunteers served nutritious meals and provided opportunities for community fellowship. All area residents were welcome. *Meals were served to:* Households 5,451 including 4,139 Adults; 310 Children; 1,190 Seniors. **Service Policy:** The Bernardine Center provides service, programs, and referrals to all in need regardless of gender, race, creed, disability or ability to pay.

Food Pantry The FY 2011-12 program provided emergency and supplemental food to 3,637 households, as well as servicing 18 homebound seniors each month. The Center distributed 164,413 pounds of food equaling 205,989 meals. Special holiday meals served:

Community Garden - The nearby Senior Center and four individuals rented six of BC's eight raised beds to grow and harvest their own produce during the garden's second bountiful season. The Center's

own six raised beds behind the building, as well as the remaining two in the Community Garden, produced enough cucumbers, tomatoes, peppers and squash to provide fresh veggies during West Side Brunch.



Computer Lab with seven computers serves to assist individual adults in job searches, typing skills, e-mail accounts, and resume writing, as well as to augment English As A Second Language skills.

Partnerships to Enhance Services: BernardineFranciscanSisters provide support and funds for the Center. Elwyn's Education Division of Transition- Aged Students with Special Needs offers service in our Food Pantry and prepares individual meals for distribution to families in need.

Goodwill, Inc. provides a trainee to learn skills and provide service in organizing, stocking and distributing supplemental meals to families seeking assistance.

Overbrook School for the Blind

provides service unpacking and stocking food on our pantry shelves.

Widener University Nursing students provided nutrition education and fresh produce to clients as a service learning project, as well as installing Skype onto three of the computers in our Computer Lab.

Volunteers provided 5,485 hours assisting staff to pull, package and distribute food to families during food distribution times, served Westside Brunch meals, taught classes and maintained the community garden.
