"Rids for Sale."


Do vou know?

- Human trafficking is the fastest growing criminal industry in the world
- It earns approximately \$32 billion dollars each year
- At least 100,000 children are used in prostitution every year in the United States
- The average age a child is first exploited through prostitution is 13 years old
- There are three categories of human trafficking victims: a) those under 18 involved in commercial sex acts, b) those 18 or over involved in commercial sex acts through force, fraud or coercion, c) those forced to perform labor and/or services in conditions of involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage or slavery through force, fraud or coercion.
- Without "demand," there would be a limited successful human trafficking trade

During the program three "actresses" playing designated roles were interviewed by attendees to learn their individual stories. Afterwards, the audience engaged in assessment of the "actresses" to determine their risk of or present involvement as trafficked sex victims.



The program was well attended with positive feedback.



Ways to identify a possible trafficking victim:

- Accompanied by a controlling person or boss; not speaking on one's own behalf
- Bruises, depression, fear, overly submissive
- Lack of control over personal schedule, money, I.D., travel documents




