Bernardine Genter Celebrates Its 25th Anniversary

Bernardine Center – a place to receive a warm helping hand – opened its door to Chester's families on February 14, 1986. What a wonderful way to celebrate Valentine's Day!

Initially, and until today, BC offered emergency and supplemental food for those individuals struggling to put meals on their family tables. In the beginning, the Bernardine Franciscan Sisters, who founded the Center, drove weekly to the Philadelphia Food Bank loading their cars with crates of food to bring back to Chester anticipating distribution to families seeking food assistance. BC staff and volunteers bagged three days of meals for each family member; that is, a family of four received twelve supplemental meals for the month. Over the succeeding years BC staff adapted to changing needs.

Today, clients coming to the BC food pantry complete a menu, itemized by food pyramid categories, based on the food items stocked on the pantry shelves; staff and volunteers package the food according to menu requests. This provides some choice of food items, and diminishes wasted food if individuals do not, or can not, eat certain types of foods. Presently, BC provides 21 meals per family member – that is, one week of supplemental food for a family for the month Menus vary weekly based on food purchases and incoming food donations.

As an enhancement to our food pantry services, BC initiated its first SuperCupboard program in November 1987 offering low-income women with children opportunities to learn about and to prepare diverse, balanced, nutritious meals based on food generally received from a food pantry. Budgeting for the most efficient purchase of food became an integral dimension of the program. The BC 8-week SuperCupboard series became a model for other nutritional programs around the country.

Gelebrating Our 25th Anniversary

Bernardine Center staff has not stood still. Over the years it added social justice and advocacy programming, empowering individuals to address the root causes of their poverty and hunger. Groups of clients and staff traveled to Washington, DC to speak on the Millennium Challenge Goals and to Harrisburg to speak up about State Food Purchase Program budgets.

BC's hospitality doors continued to open with its West Side Brunch in 2001, meeting a need for individuals on the west side of the city to receive a free, warm, nutritious brunch meal. Today BC serves brunches three times a week the support of the Community Arts for the many individuals who seek Center in Wallingford. not only a warm meal but a social outlet and friendships as well.

In 2002 staff began missing certain senior individuals who had utilized the food pantry services. Calls to their homes uncovered their inability to get to the Center because of compromised mobility or other health problems. Bernardine Center's homebound food delivery became an added ministry to insure that disabled seniors had adequate food resources monthly.

New and gently-used clothing has always been accessible for those families looking to deck themselves out for job interviews, school, or warm winter and cool summer attire. Personal care supplies, new warm winter blankets, bed sheets, coats, scarves and gloves are annual provisions offered to families seeking support.

Installation of the food lift, or dumbwaiter, in June 2009 eased a bit of the stair-climbing-carrying power that staff and volunteers endured for all the past years. The goodwill and brawn with which staff and volunteers receive, separate, shelve and then distribute thousands of pounds of food weekly is an every day, behind the scenes, feat.

Eight raised garden beds enhanced BC's corner lot as the community garden debuted in spring 2009 providing an opportunity for foodinsecure families to grow some of their own healthy produce. Integral to the garden are assistance and oversight by our cheerful and generous master gardener as well as the support of Chester Friends Meeting.

BC celebrated, in October 2009, the completion and dedication of its awesome mural depicting bounteous creation. "Spring Forth," as it is entitled, graces our outside wall due to the artistry of Paul Downie and
